- The above-referenced section of the Motor Vehicle Code provides specific authority for school entities to enter into agreements with entities like BusPatrol to implement a side stop signal arm enforcement program.
- BusPatrol will upgraded the technology on all 43 buses, including cameras (interior and exterior), sensors, equipment, components, products, and other tangible property that compromises the Bus Patrol System.
- Advanced safety technology at \$0 to school districts, municipalities or taxpayers


