WSSD Extended School Year



Extended Day AS/ES

Extended Day – AS (Grades Kindergarten – 12+)

This is an extended day program for students on the Autism Spectrum (although a diagnosis is not required). In addition to academics, students participate in inclusive activities with peers, and in specialized programming including sensory activities, social skills, and community-based instructions, etc.

Speech and Occupational Therapy are integrated into the afternoon sessions.

Dates: Four-week program, typically in July (exact dates vary year to year)

Frequency (Times): 8:30- 1:30; Monday – Thursday_

Extended Day – Emotional Support– (Kindergarten –12)

This is an extended day program for students with Emotional Support needs. Students participate in academic programming, personal development programming, individual counseling, and group counseling.

Dates: Four-week program, typically in July (exact dates vary year to year)

Frequency (Times): 8:30- 1:30; Monday – Thursday

- Academics are taught by qualified certified teachers
- Specific IEP goals are the focus of maintenance instruction
- Additional opportunities for practice of basic skills is provided
- Both reading and math instruction offers a combination of online practice and reinforcement,
 and in-person teaching
- Instruction includes research-based interventions
- Academic instruction will occur within the summer classrooms OR within the extended day classroom if small group or individual instruction is required

11:30 – 1:30 Related Services and Social Skills

- Students will receive related services as outlined in the IEP
- Services provided by Certified Speech and Language Therapists, Licensed Occupational Therapist and Licensed Physical Therapist
- AS Social Skills instruction focuses on the principles of research-based programs. Lesson examples are:
 - Identifying the expected vs. the unexpected
 - Practicing perspective taking and relating it to behavior
 - Connecting Expectations and Perspective to Consequences
 - Using Dyads to practice generalization
 - All group activities are facilitated by a special education teacher AND a certified speech and Language therapist with experience social skills areas
- ES Social Skills instruction utilizes research-based programs, however, will use best practice techniques and strategies from counseling
